Now comes Joseph T. Deters, the duly qualified Prosecuting Attorney of said County, and by way of Information says that the Defendant engaged in the following conduct:

COUNT ONE - CONSPIRACY AGAINST TRADE

Beginning at least as early as June 12, 2003 and continuing to on or about July 30, 2008 within the county of Hamilton, or by some manner enumerated in Section 2901.12 of the Ohio Revised Code whereby proper venue is placed in the county aforementioned, Timothy O'Brien engaged in a conspiracy against trade for the sale of equipment and supplies for traffic control systems within the State of Ohio. The conspiracy against trade engaged in by defendant Timothy O'Brien and his co-conspirators was an unreasonable restraint of trade and commerce in violation of Section 1331.04 of the Ohio Revised Code, a misdemeanor of the first degree.

The charged conspiracy, or combination of acts, included actions the purpose and effect of which were to:

- (i) create and carry out restrictions in trade and commerce; and/or
- (ii) increase the price of commodities; and/or
- (iii) prevent competition in the sale of merchandise and commodities; and/or
- (iv) carry out agreements whereby the defendant and his co-conspirators established and settled the price of commodities between themselves so as to directly preclude free and unrestricted competition among themselves in the sale of such commodities.

For the purpose of forming and carrying out the charged conspiracy against trade, Timothy O'Brien and his co-conspirators did those things they combined and conspired to do, including, among other things:

Now comes Joseph T. Deters, the duly qualified Prosecuting Attorney of said County, and by way of Information says that the Defendant herein engaged in the following conduct:

COUNT ONE: PROHIBITION AGAINST ENTERING INTO AN UNLAWFUL COMBINATION, CONTRACT OR AGREEMENT

Beginning at least as early as June 12, 2003 and continuing to on or about July 30, 2008 within the county of Hamilton, or by some manner enumerated in Section 2901.12 of the Ohio Revised Code whereby proper venue is placed in the county aforementioned, Quattro Inc. did knowingly enter a combination, contract, or agreement with Bain Industries/Bain Enterprises and other unnamed co-conspirators with the intent to limit or fix the price of an article of commerce, to wit: the sale of equipment and supplies for traffic control systems in violation of Section 1331.02 of the Ohio Revised Code, a felony of the fifth degree.

COUNT TWO: TAMPERING WITH RECORDS

Beginning at least as early as June 12, 2003 and continuing to on or about July 30, 2008. within the county of Hamilton, or by some manner enumerated in Section 2901.12 of the Ohio Revised Code whereby proper venue is placed in the county aforementioned, Quattro Inc. knowing that it had no privilege to do so, and knowing that it was facilitating a fraud, did utter a writing or record; to wit: bids to limit or fix the price of an article of commerce were submitted to Ohio public entities. The commission of the offense was authorized and/or performed by a high managerial officer or employee acting in behalf of the organization and within the scope of his employment.



V.

Defendant uttered the bids knowing that the writing or records were falsified or altered, and the writing or record is kept or belongs to a local, state or federal governmental entity, to wit: the Ohio Department of Transportation and the City of Hudson in violation of Section 2913.42(A)(2) of the Ohio Revised Code, a felony of the third degree.

COUNT THREE: TELECOMMUNICATIONS FRAUD

Beginning at least as early as June 12, 2003 and continuing to on or about July 30, 2008, within the county of Hamilton, or by some manner enumerated in Section 2901.12 of the Ohio Revised Code whereby proper venue is placed in the county aforementioned, Defendant Quattro Inc. knowing that it had no privilege to do so, and having devised a scheme to defraud, to wit: price fixing, knowingly disseminated, transmitted, or caused to be disseminated or transmitted by means of wire, telecommunication, telecommunications device, or telecommunications service a writing, data, sign, signal, picture, sound, or image; to wit: bids to limit or fix the price of an article of commerce.

The commission of the offense was authorized and/or performed by a high managerial officer or employee acting in behalf of the organization and within the scope of his employment. The bids were transmitted or disseminated with the purpose to execute or otherwise further the scheme to defraud and the value of the benefit obtained by Defendant Quattro Inc. is one thousand dollars or more but less than seven thousand five hundred dollars in violation of Section 2913.05 of the Ohio Revised Code, a felony of the fourth degree.

COUNT FOUR: MONEY LAUNDERING

Beginning at least as early as May 14, 2007 and continuing to on or about June 22, 2007, within the county of Hamilton, or by some manner enumerated in Section 2901.12 of the Ohio Revised Code whereby proper venue is placed in the county aforementioned, Defendant Quattro Inc. conduct a transaction with purpose to promote, manage, establish, carry on, or facilitate the promotion, management, establishment or carrying on of corrupt activity in violation of Section 1315.55(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code, a felony of the third degree.

The commission of the offense was authorized and/or performed by a high managerial officer or employee acting in behalf of the organization and within the scope of his employment.


